David,

We recommend acquiring a SSL certificate for your domain so you can host all assets like JavaScript, CSS, images, video, audio, etc.; and prevent any security issues from rendering on clients.

As far as tunneling images through a specialized wrapper -- I couldn't tell you. I'll check with a developer who might have a trick up their sleeve.

I just found a better solution for my particular problem, that may help others trying to do the same thing - Michael at the phone tech help desk helped me with this.

If you upload the images you want to use to the Company Files or Company images area, you can pull them into a secure shopping cart skin or order form by using their URL from within the system.

To upload, click the flyout arrow on the left within Infusion, and click Files. You can upload into a personal area for you as a User, into a Company Files, or into a Company Images area. I think any of them would work. After you upload the image, you can roll over the image title with the mouse and read the URL in the browser at the bottom.

Use the beginning of the URL, up to the ID number, and discard the rest. Here's an example:

Gregg,
Make sure that you test this while NOT logged into your application.

I believe that the only one of those image upload areas work for viewing externally of being logged in.

I would suggest going into your email template and make a new html email. Then just use the add an image icon to upload your image to the server. Then you can see the url right before you insert it. This is a guaranteed way to make sure everyone can see your infusionsoft hosted images.
